Walking and Bicycling Targeted in MPO Report

The newly available MPO report, *Bicycle and Pedestrian Improvements in Town Centers*, identifies relatively low-cost, easy-to-implement improvements to the pedestrian and bicycle environments in six small-town centers. It is designed to be a resource for those towns, and also to provide models for possible use in other municipalities.

The recommendations in the report are aimed at:

- Improving access to town centers from nearby residential neighborhoods
- Improving the connectivity of the existing bicycle and pedestrian networks
- Making walking and bicycling safer and more desirable ways of getting around

The six town centers that were evaluated in the report (in Duxbury, Essex, Holbrook, Lynnfield, Norfolk, and Southborough) are representative of the various types of town centers in the region.

Recommended improvements include resurfacing existing sidewalks, repainting crosswalks, installing new wheelchair

MPO Seeks Comments on 2007 TIP Amendment and Draft 2008-2011 TIP

On June 21 the Boston Region MPO's Transportation Planning and Programming Committee voted to release for public comment an amendment to the 2007 element of the federal fiscal years (FFYs) 2007-2010 Transportation Improvement Program and Air Quality Conformity Determination (TIP) and a draft FFYs 2008-2011 TIP. The TIP is a four-year capital spending program for improvements to the region's transportation system.

The public comment period for the FFY 2007 amendment began on June 26 and the public comment period for the FFYs 2008-2010 TIP began on July 2.

Both comment periods will close at 5:00 PM on July 31.

The MPO has organized four workshops around the region to hear residents' and local officials' views on these spending programs (see the meeting calendar for details).

BOSTON REGION MPO ACTION ITEMS

In addition to releasing an amendment to the 2007 element of the FFYs 2007–2010 TIP and a draft FFYs 2008–2011 TIP for public review (see page 1), the MPO's Transportation Planning and Programming Committee approved two work programs that will be conducted by the Central Transportation Planning Staff (CTPS). Under the first work program, CTPS will create map sets that will be posted in rapid transit stations to show nearby bus routes and points of interest. The second work program involves surveying users of the parking lot at the Green Line's Lechmere Station. The survey results will help the MBTA determine the size of the parking area that the MBTA will have to build when the station is relocated. The MPO is also in the process of developing its draft FFY 2008 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP), which will propose funding for transportation planning and studies in the region. The UPWP is currently scheduled for release for public comment in late July or early August.

REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION ADVISORY COUNCIL UPDATE

Dr. Chris Caplice, of MIT's Center for Transportation and Logistics (CTL) and Executive Director of MIT's Master of Engineering in Logistics program, gave a presentation to the Advisory Council in June on the potential for economic growth and improved supply chain management that could be achieved by connecting freight corridors to ports. Through his research, Dr. Caplice has identified significant communication gaps between private-sector shippers and carriers and public officials. To help

resolve this issue, CTL will host a forum in November for stakeholders involved in supply chain management in the commonwealth.

In other news, the Advisory Council created a subcommittee to recommend a formal position on the Storrow Drive Tunnel Project to the Storrow Drive Advisory Council. Also, members were reminded about upcoming elections for Advisory Council chair and vice chair.

ACCESS ADVISORY COMMITTEE TO THE MBTA (AACT) UPDATE

AACT members were introduced to Gary Talbot, the MBTA's new Assistant General Manager for Systemwide

Accessibility, in June.

The newly created Metro-West Regional Transit Authority has entered into a two-year contract for para-transit services with the MBTA effective July 1, 2007, through June 30, 2009. The contract will provide for the seamless continuation of THE RIDE service to the ADA-eligible customers in the Framingham/Natick area.

This summer, AACT members will have the opportunity to review new Blue Line subway cars now undergoing braking and propulsion testing on a test track at the Wellington Station maintenance facility.
